

Comparison of Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rate





In January 2024, Idaho's Total Nonfarm Added 300 Jobs, Essentially Unchanged



### Statewide Seasonally Adjusted Change by Industry




Over-the-month Change in Nonfarm Payroll Jobs by Industry, January 2024

#### Over-the-year Change in Nonfarm Payroll Jobs by Industry, January 2024





# Idaho Nonfarm Jobs (CES): Statewide Seasonally Adjusted Change by MSA




#### Over-the-month Change in Total Nonfarm Payroll, January 2024

#### Over-the-year Change in Total Nonfarm Payroll, January 2024






### **Population**


- The state's labor force eligible population was overestimated by an average of 14,826 (1%) residents for each month of 2023.
- The difference after benchmark for 2022's population was an average of 13,057 (0.9%).

### **Labor Force & Employment**


 Labor Force decreased by an average of 4,026 (0.4%) per month after benchmarking, while total employment decreased by 5,978 (0.6%).


### LAUS Benchmark Review






- The number of unemployed Idahoans increased by a monthly average of 1,951 (7%) after benchmark.
- This resulted in an average increase to the unemployment rate of 0.2 across 2023.
- Because the labor force decreased by a smaller margin compared to the population, there was an increase to the labor force participation rate of 0.3.


