

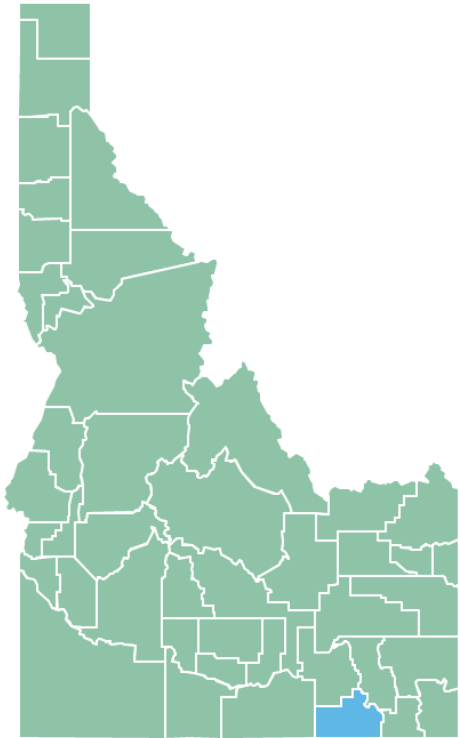

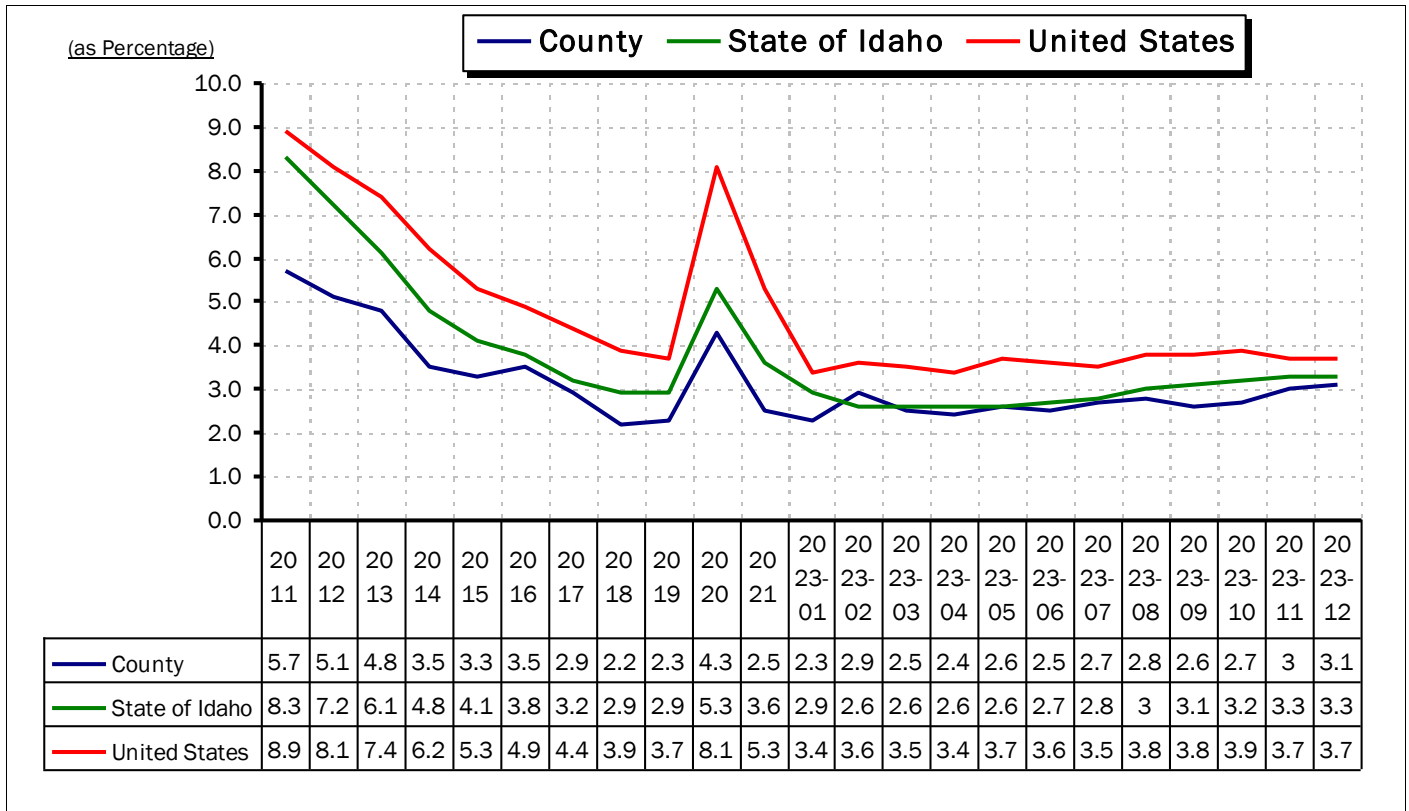

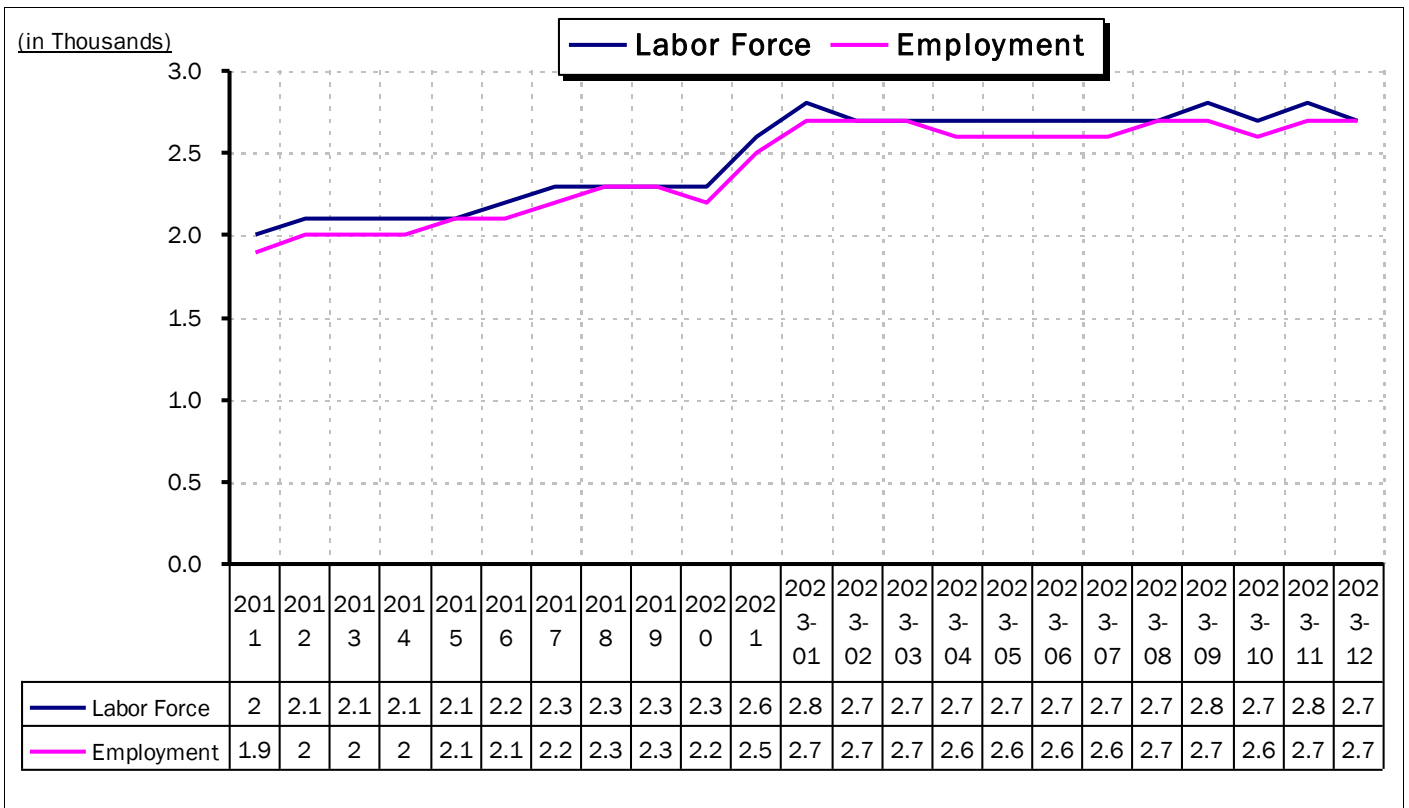

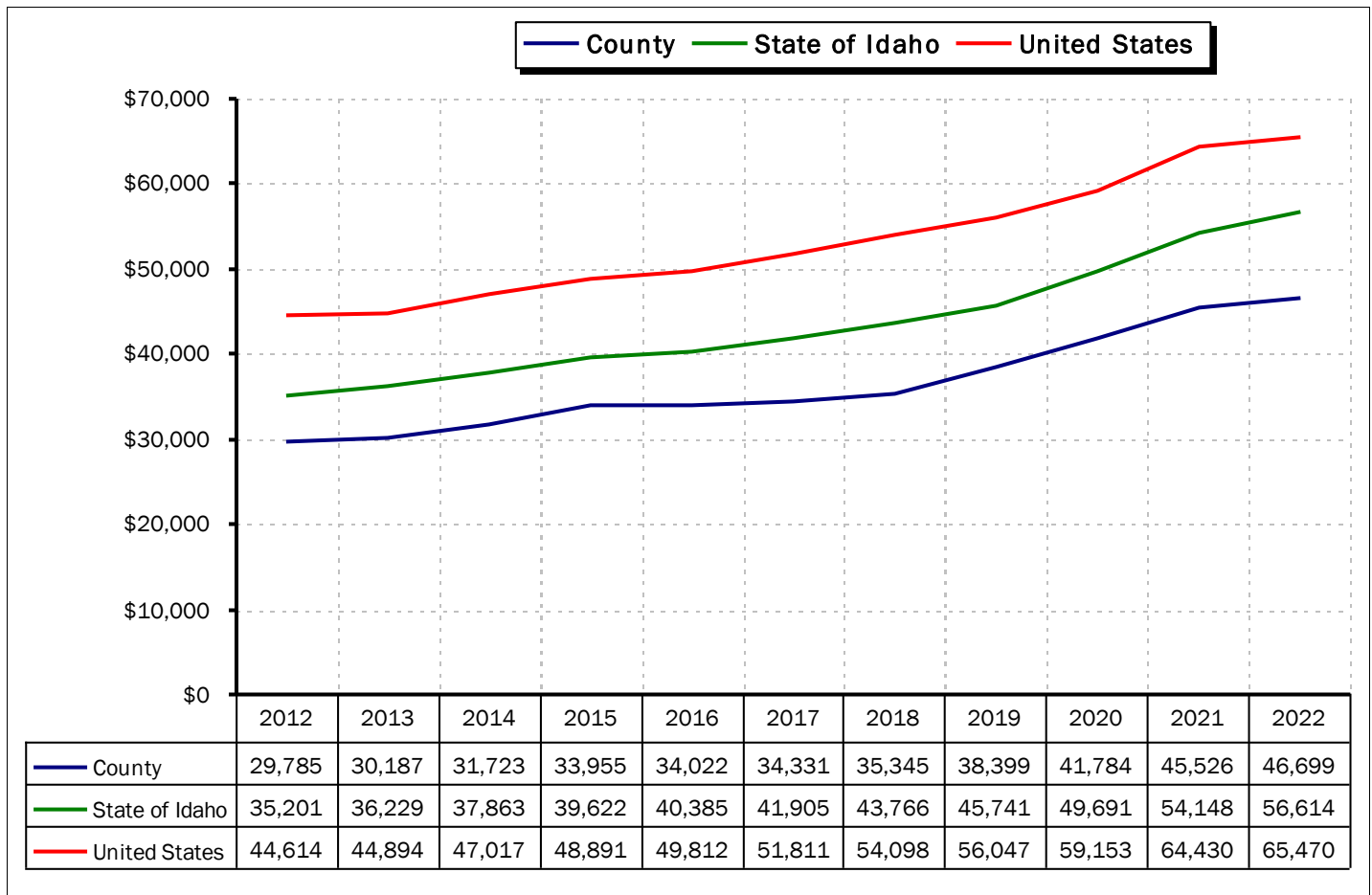

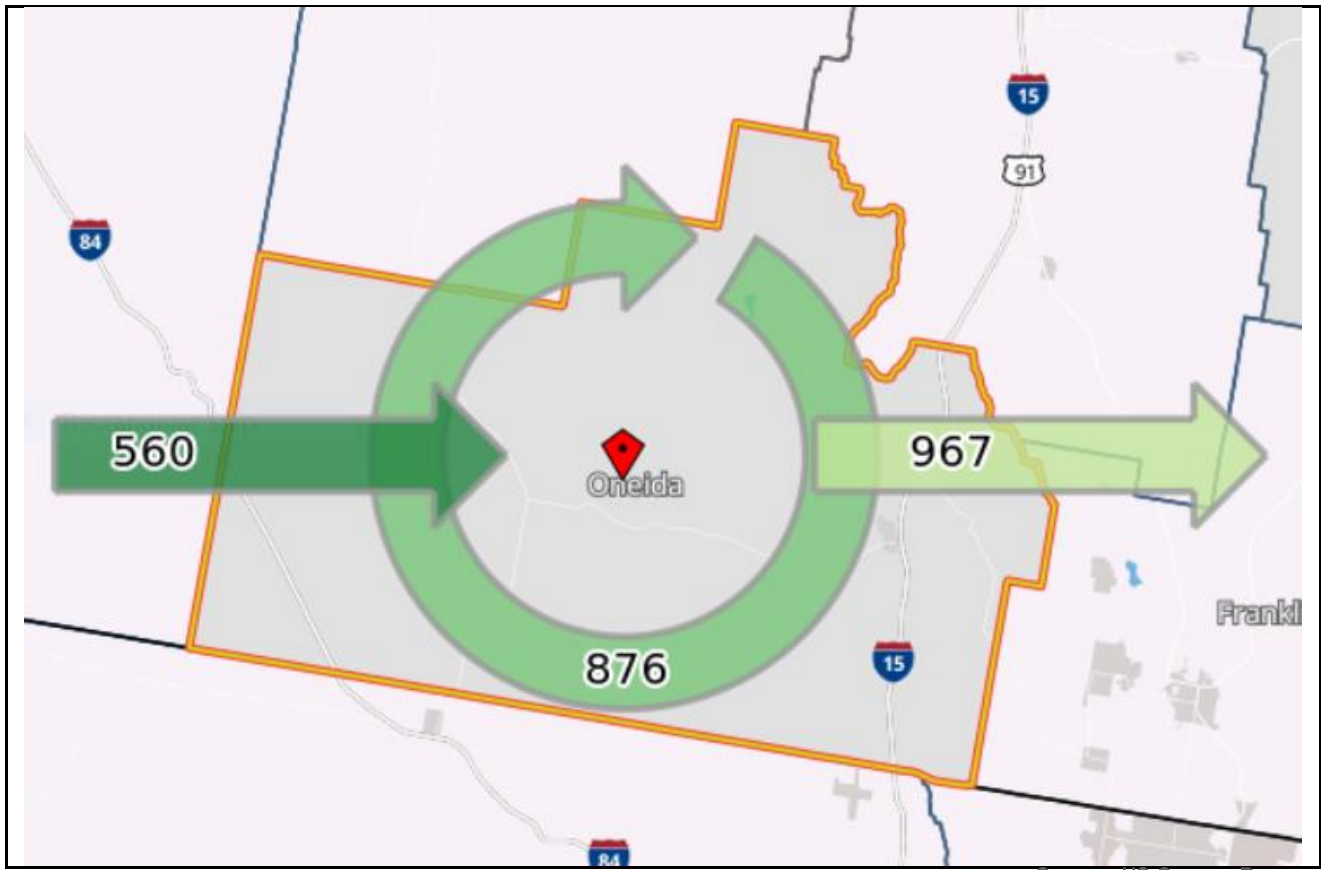
## 7. Real Per Capita Income, 2012 to 2022
