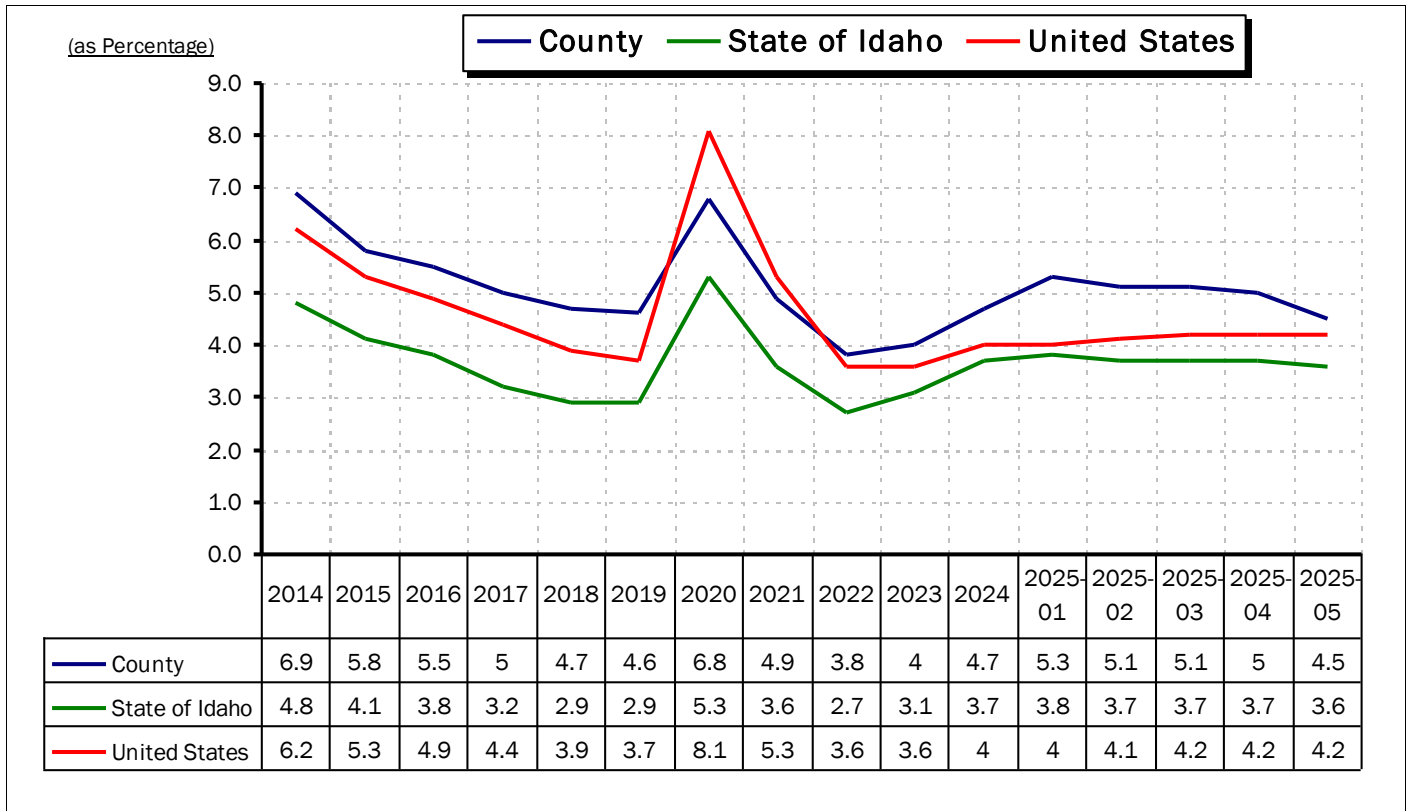

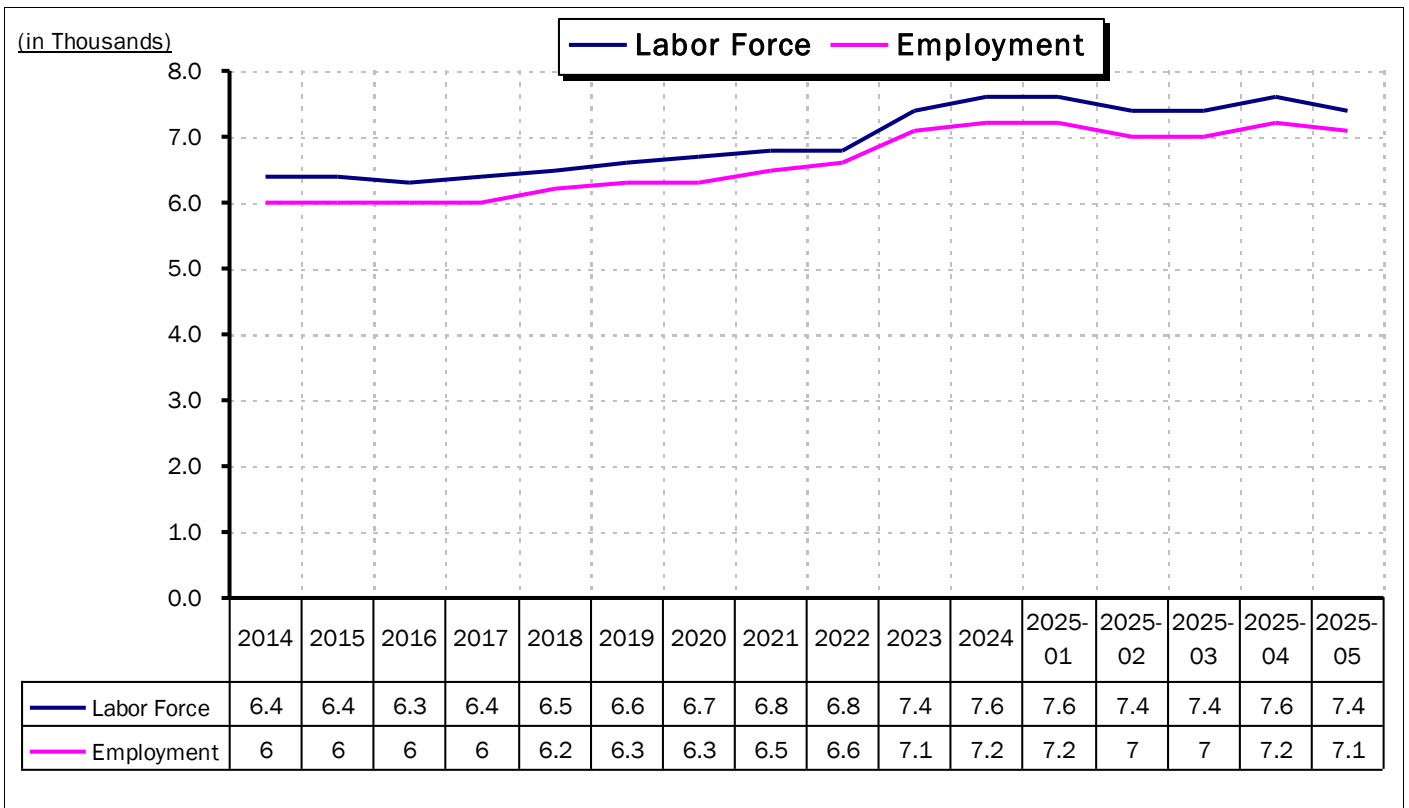

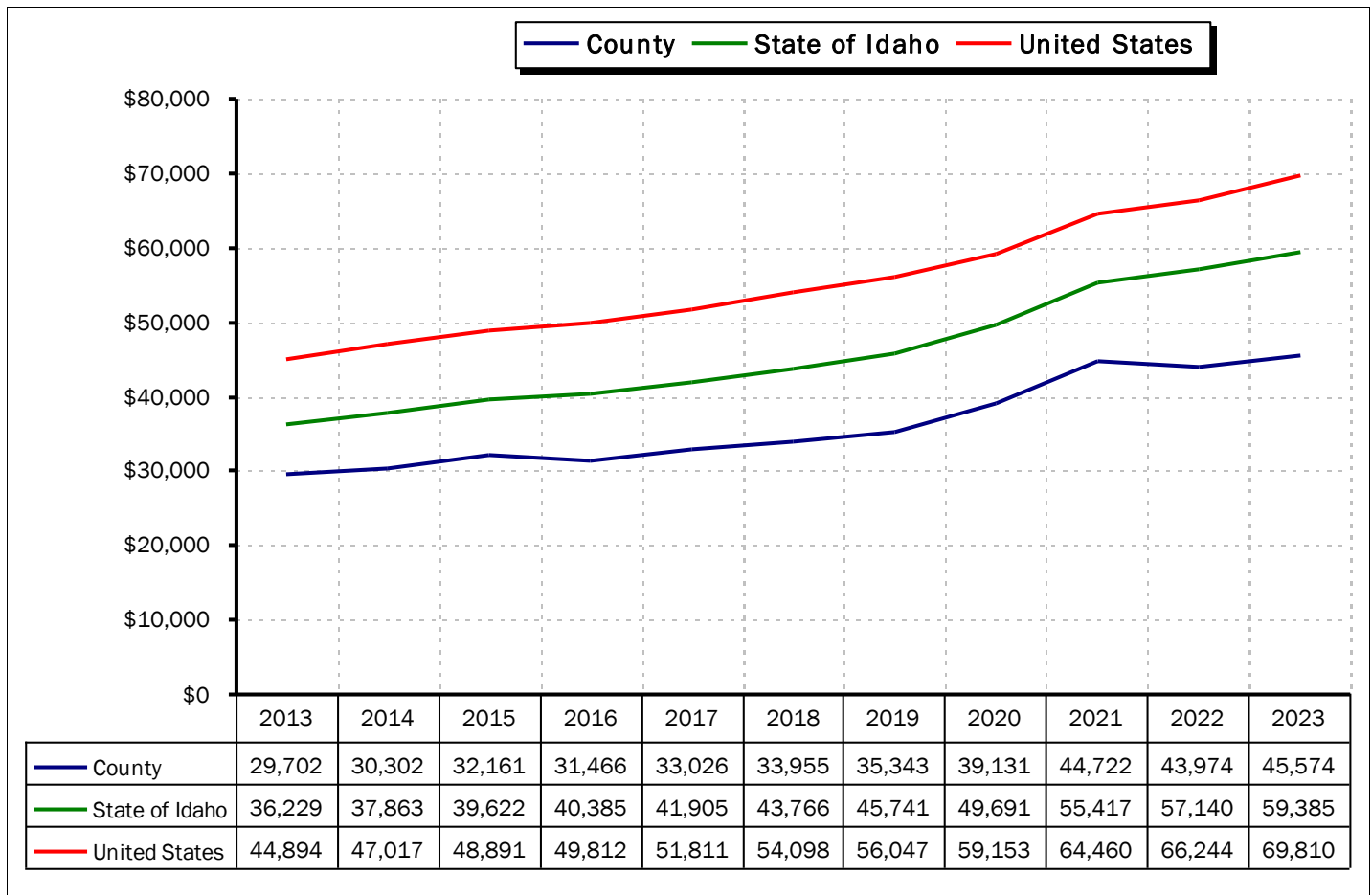

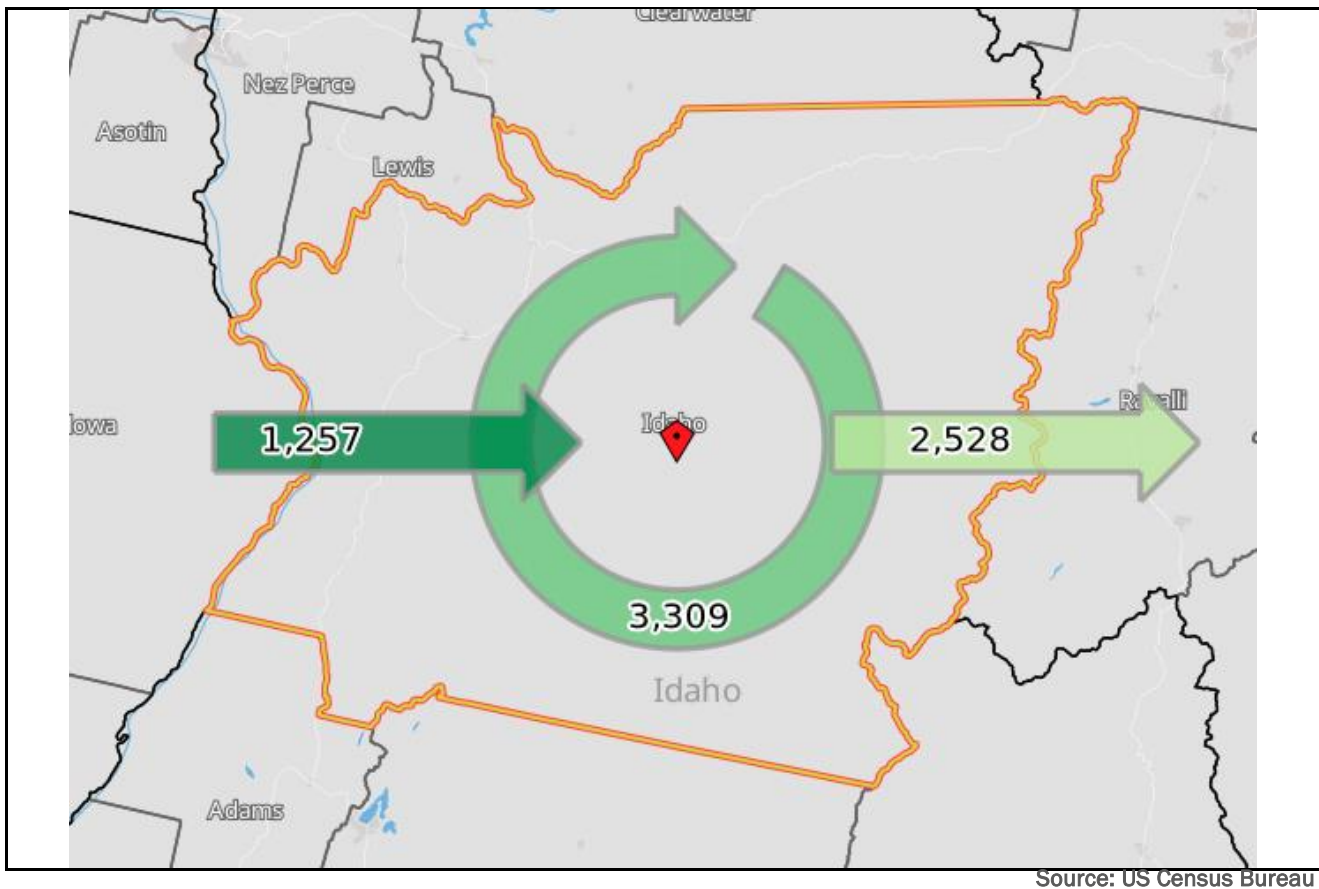
## 7. Real Per Capita Income, 2013 to 2023
