Idaho's top agricultural commodities

• National commodity rankings

- More than 185 commodities.
- Top national producer of potatoes, barley, peppermint, trout and alfalfa hay.



Agricultural acres by urban/rural

- Losses between 2002-2022
 - 2022 total acres = 11.6 million
 - Acres lost: 219,000 or 1.9% decline.



Agricultural farms by urban/rural

- Losses between 2002-2022
 - 2022 total farms = 23,000 (approx.)
 - Farms lost: 2,100 or 8.6% decline.
- Results
 - Average farm size increased by 35 acres to 505, or 7.4%.
 - Revenue increased 179%.



Farm revenue, 2022

- Dominated by cattle and milk at a combined \$6 billion.
- Potatoes in third place at \$1 billion.
- County ranking:
 - First: Cassia, south central
 - Rural center: 1.2 billion
 - Second: Twin Falls, south central
 - Urban: \$1.1 billion
 - Third: Gooding, south central
 - Open country: \$1.1 billion
 - Fourth: Jerome, south central
 - Commuting: \$900 million
 - Fifth: Canyon, southwestern
 - Urban: \$800 million
