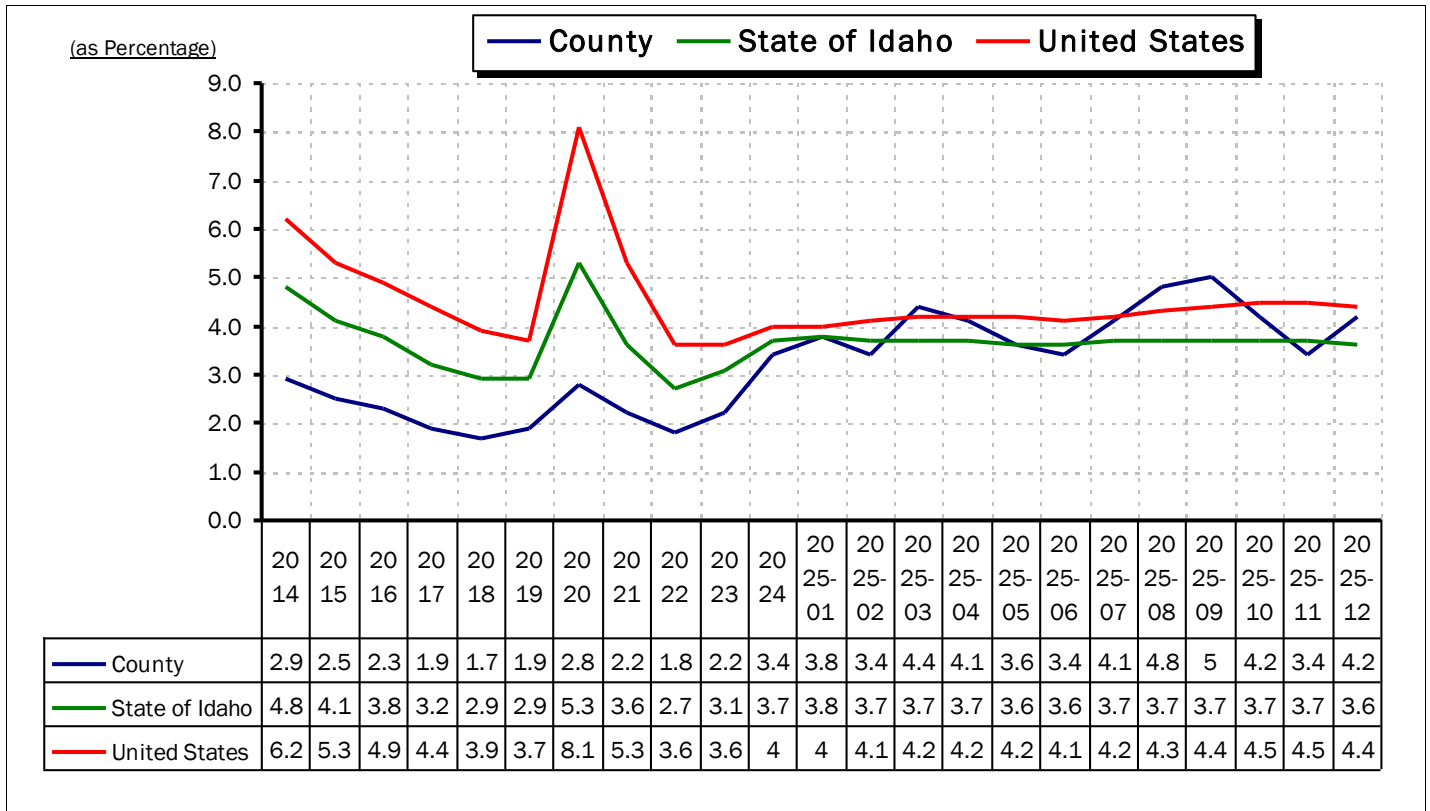

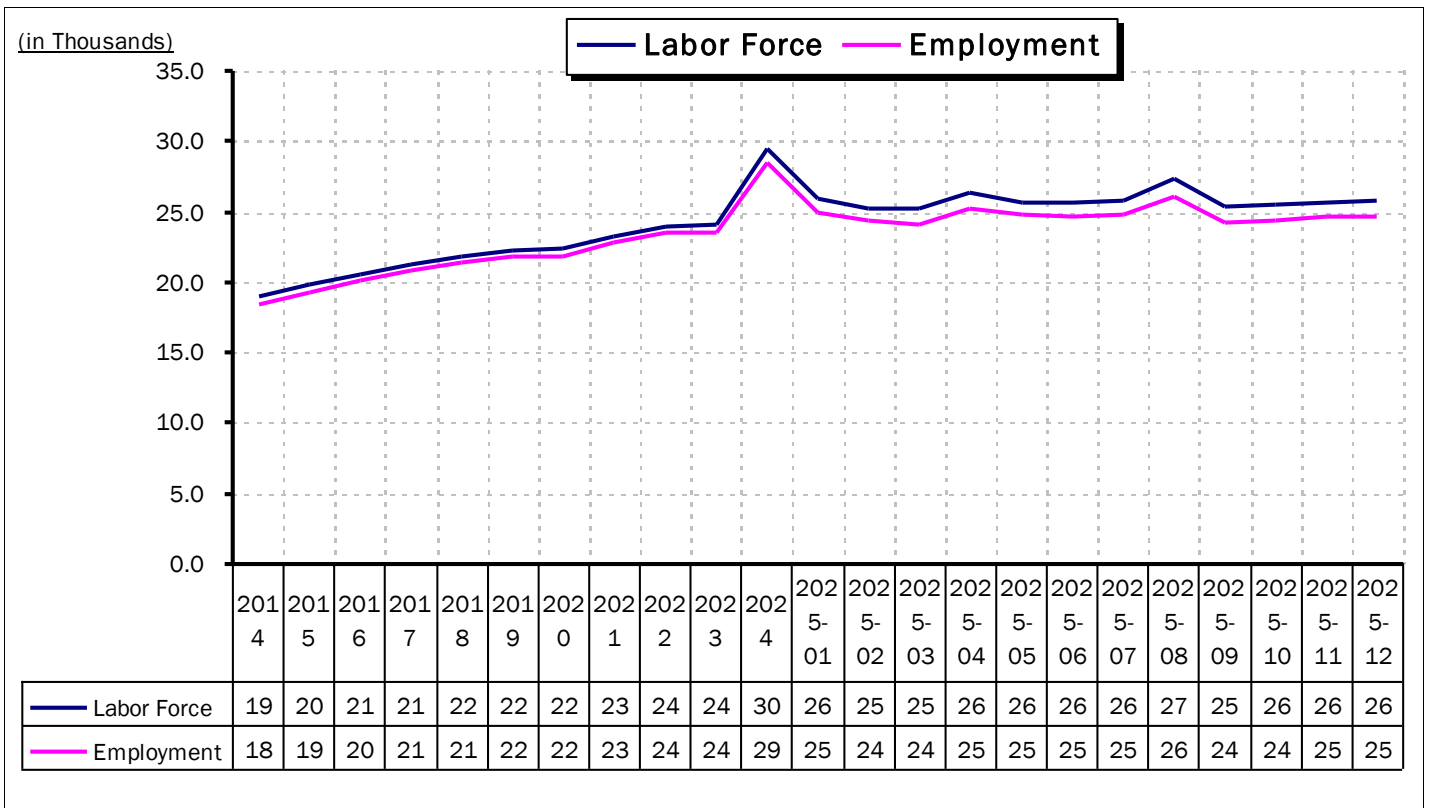

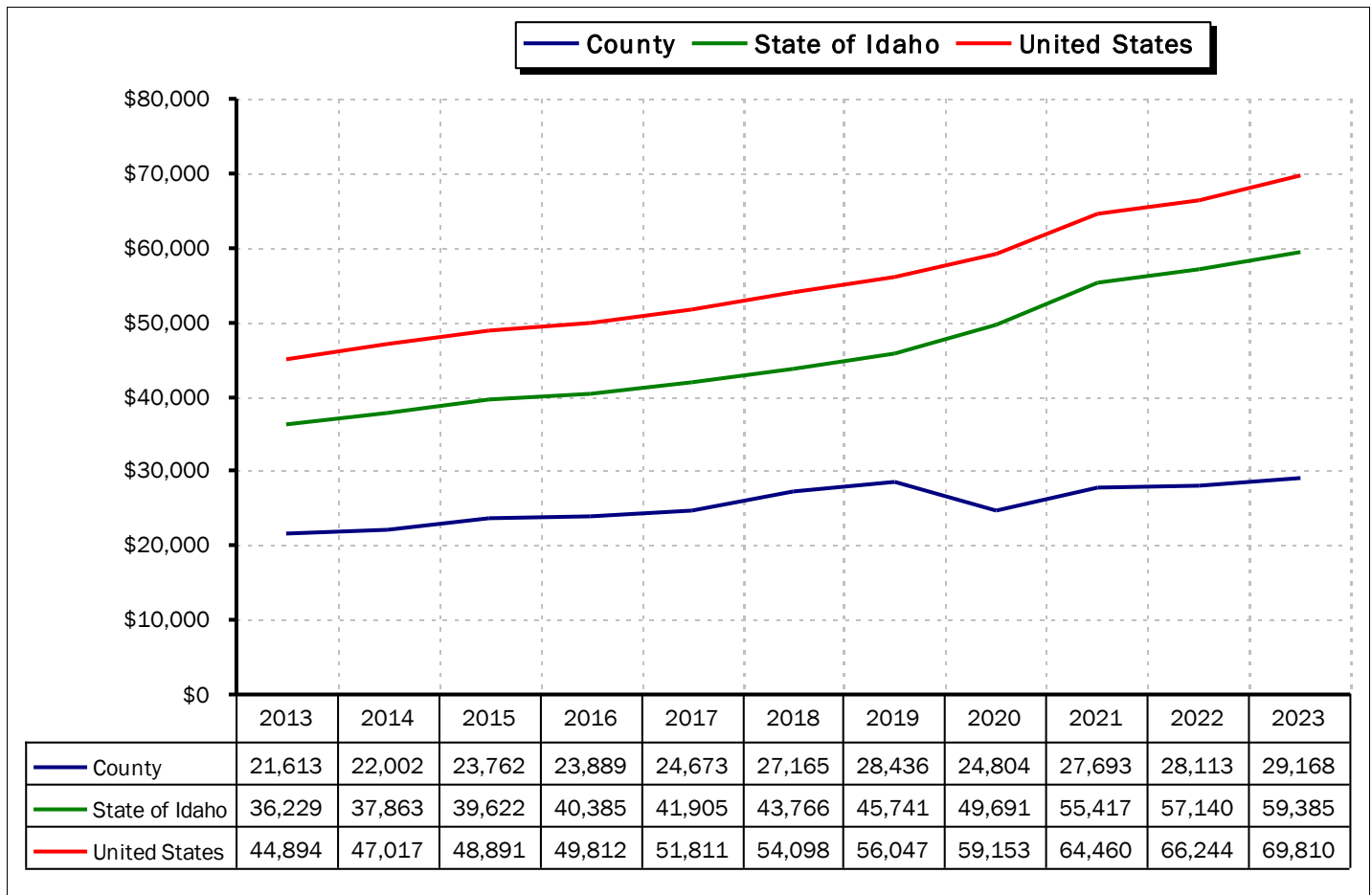

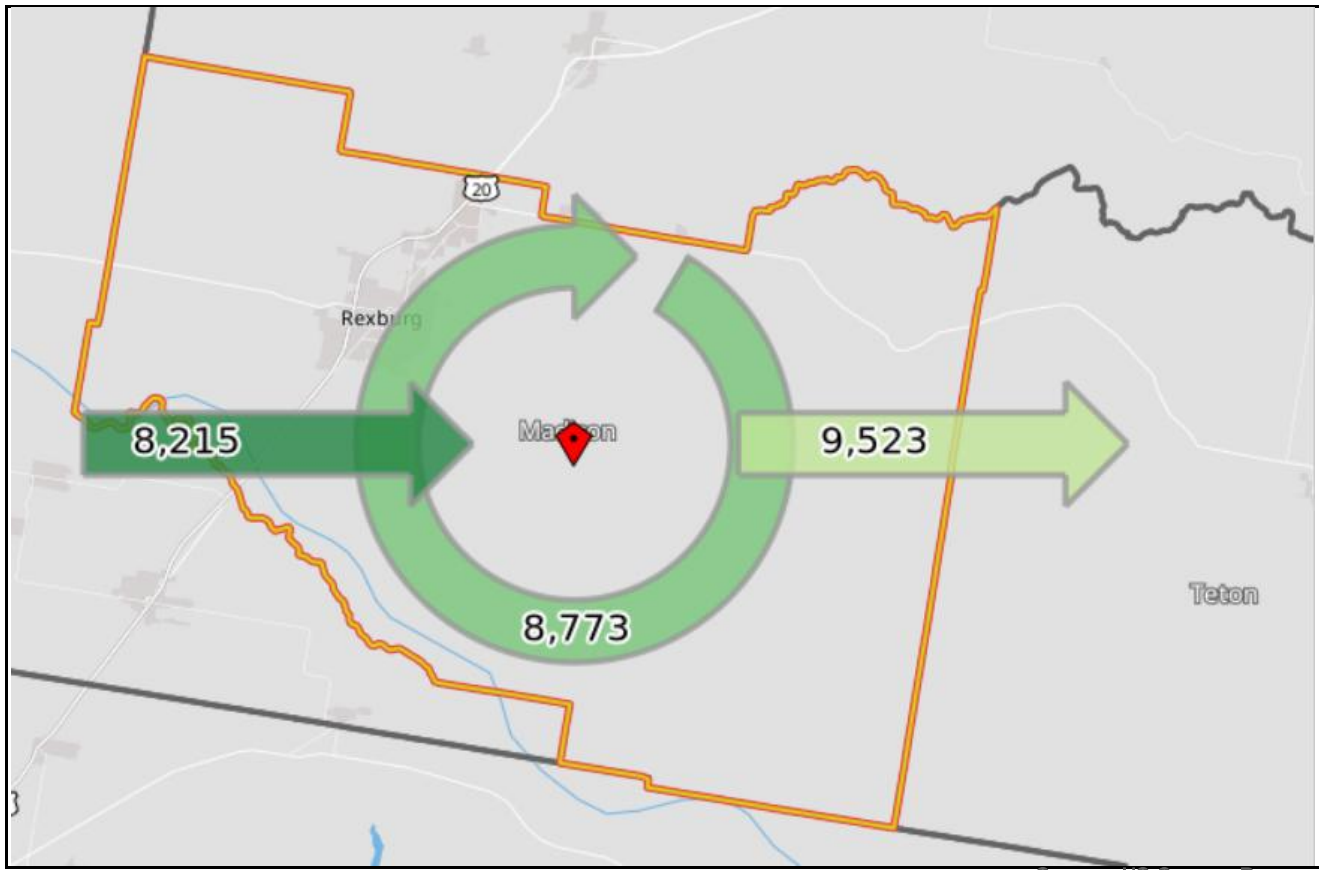
7. Real Per Capita Income, 2013 to 2023

It is estimated that 8,773 workers lived and worked in Madison County in 2023. Another 8,215 workers were employed in Madison County but lived outside, while 9,523 workers commuted to other counties for work.
