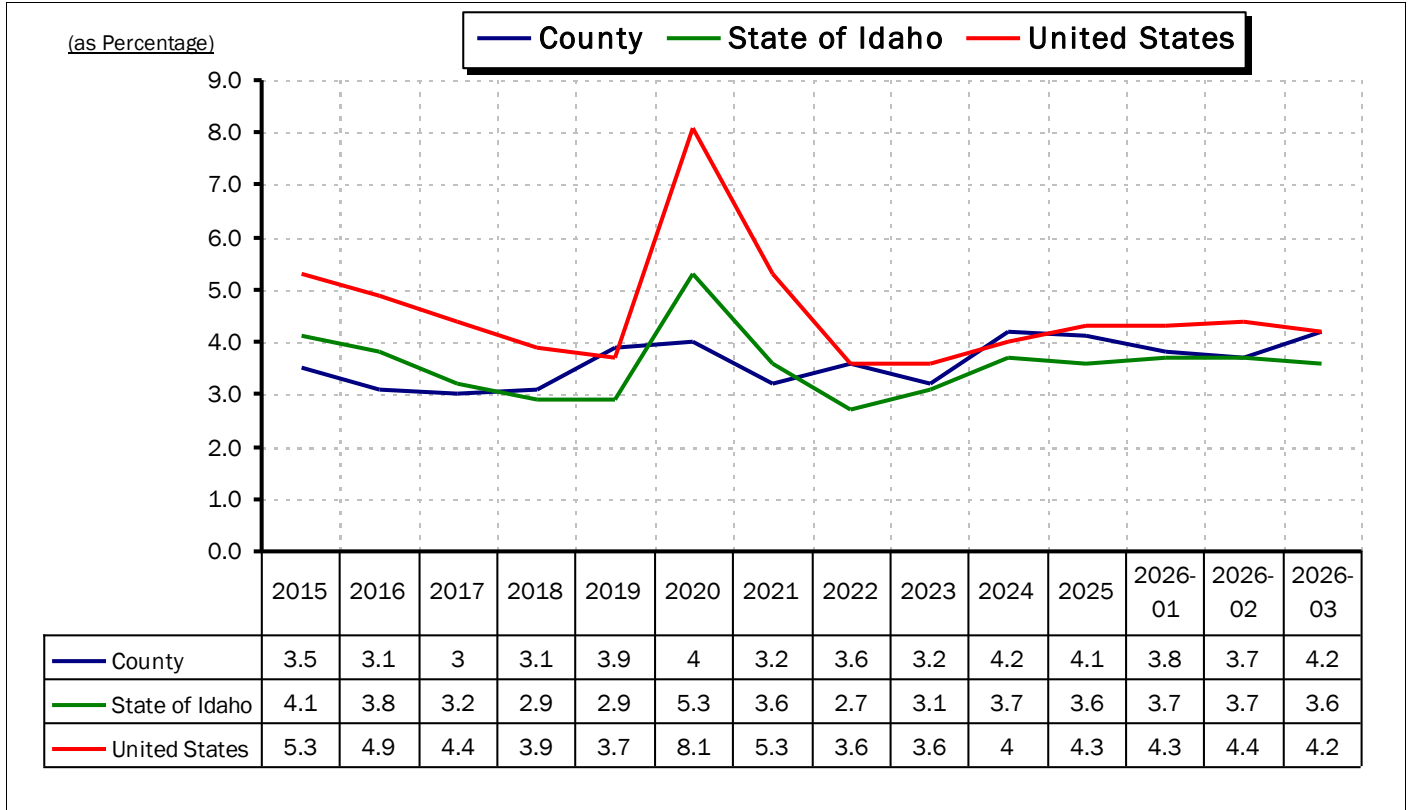

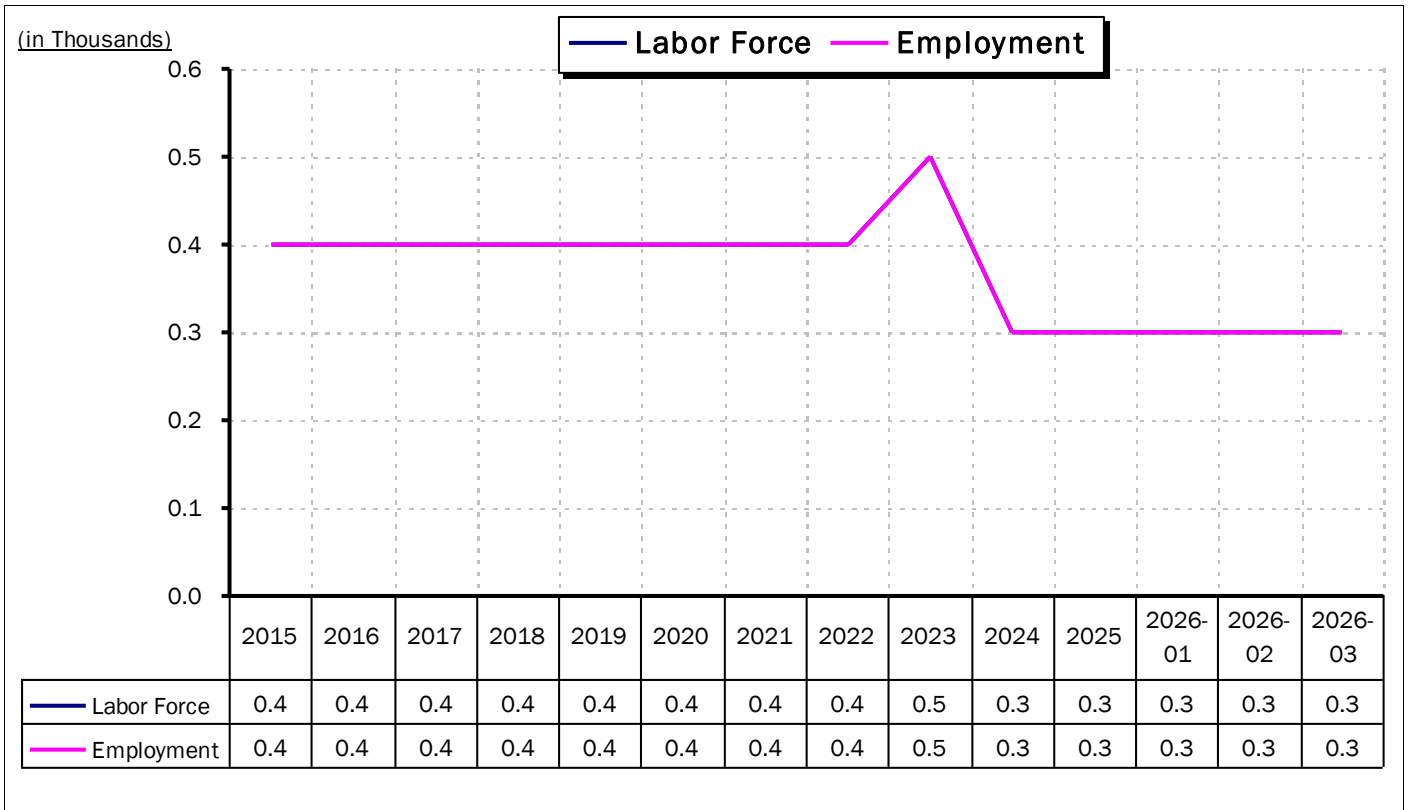

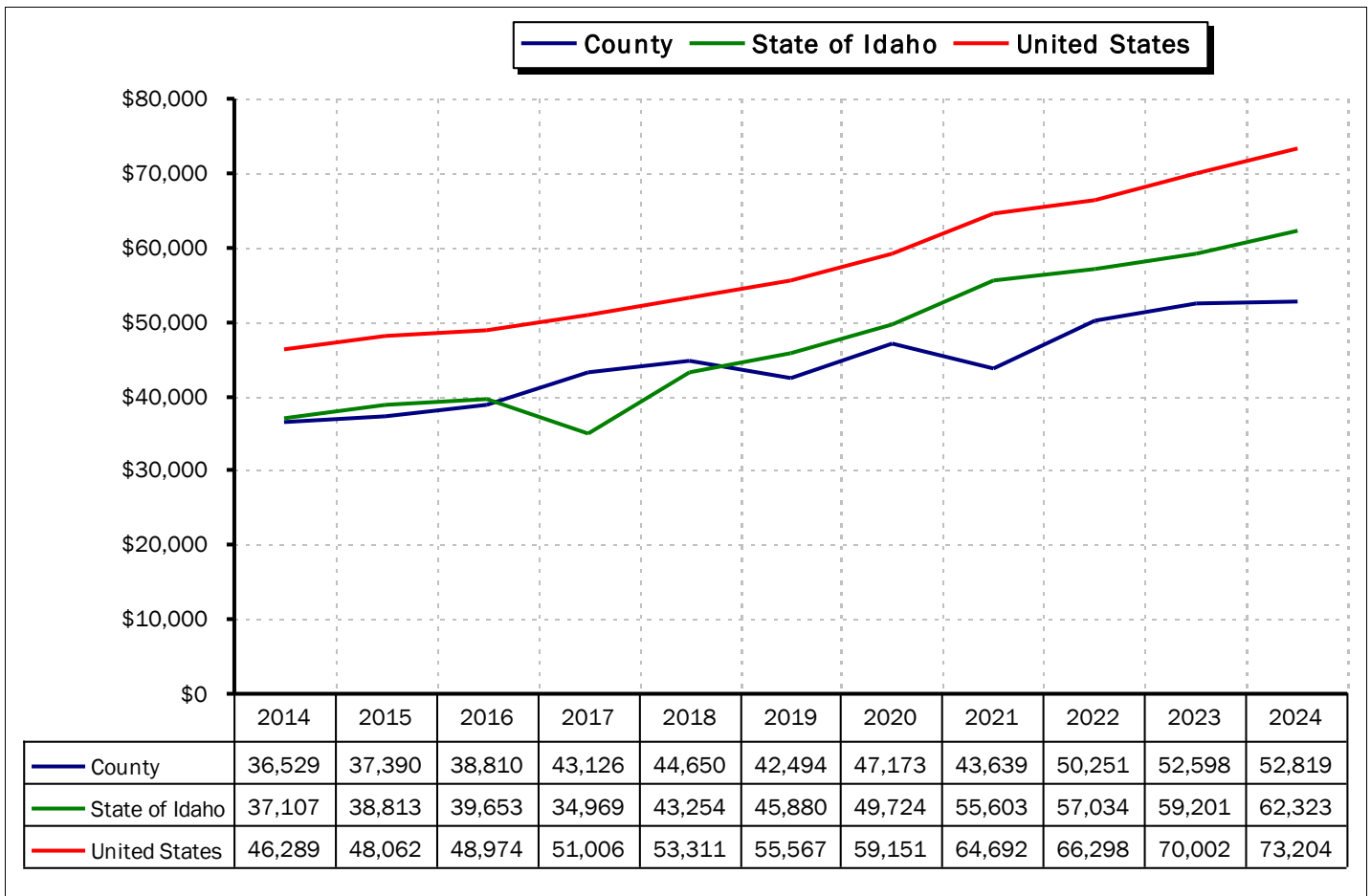

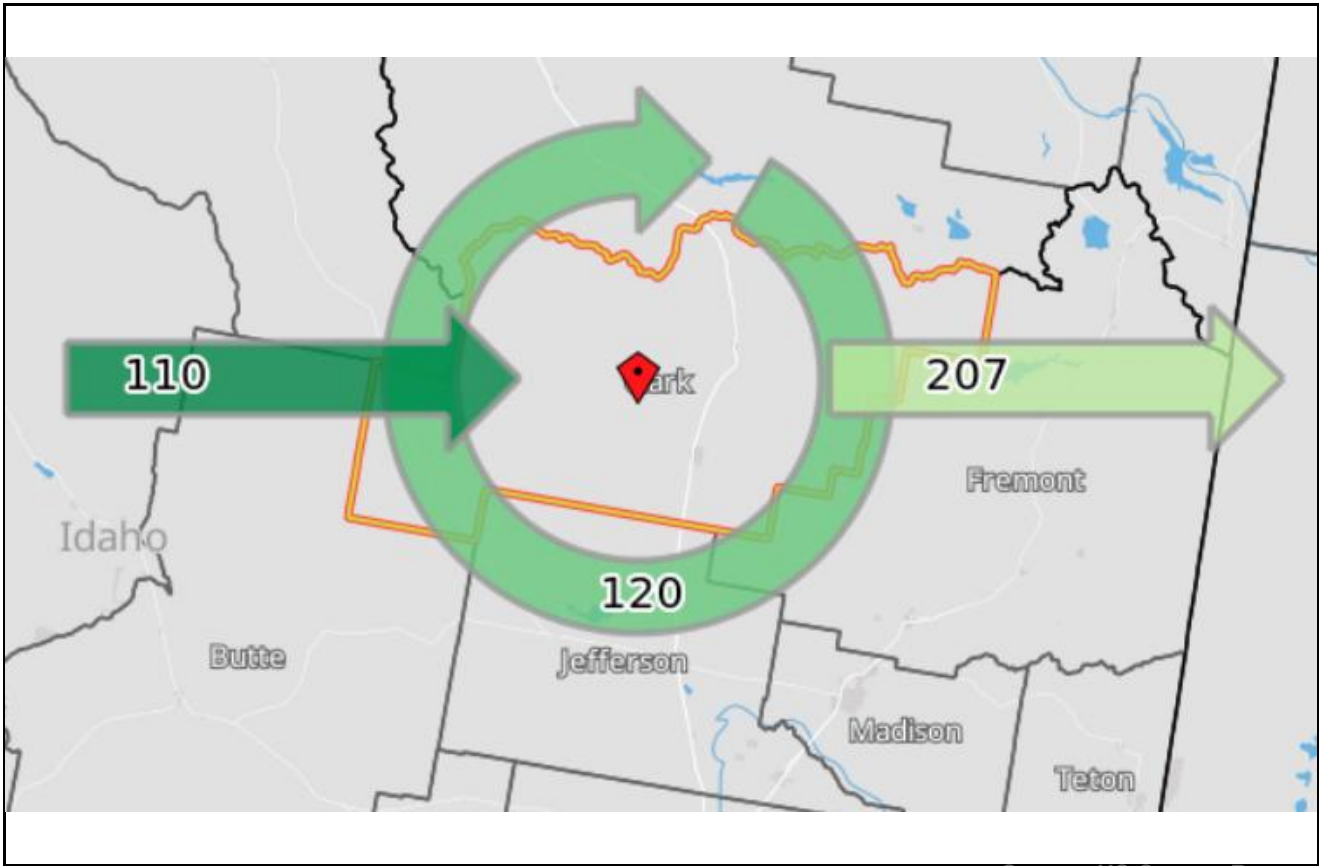
## 7. Per Capita Income, 2014 to 2024
