

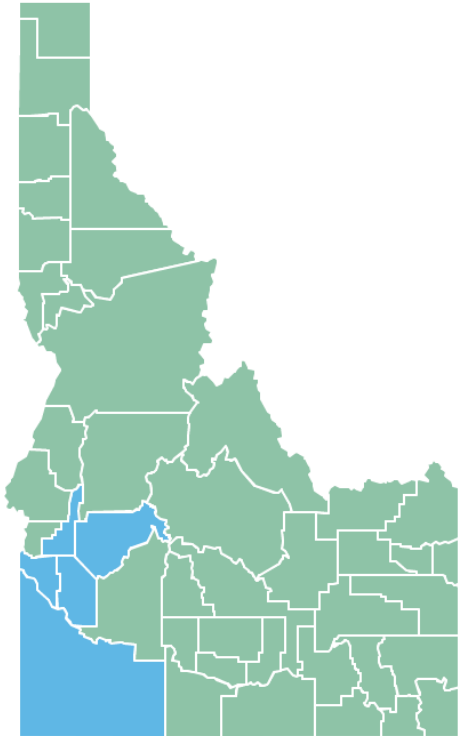

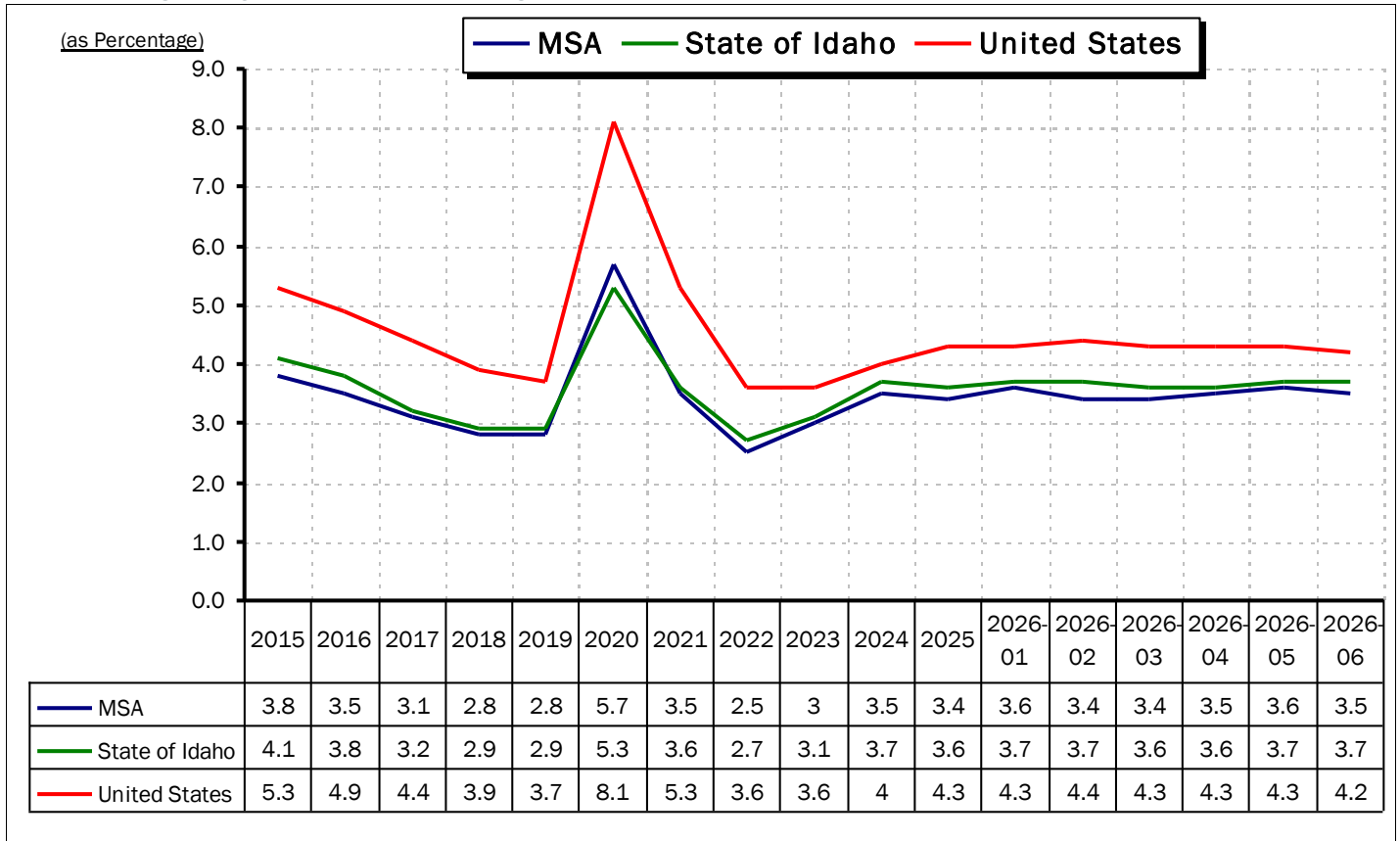

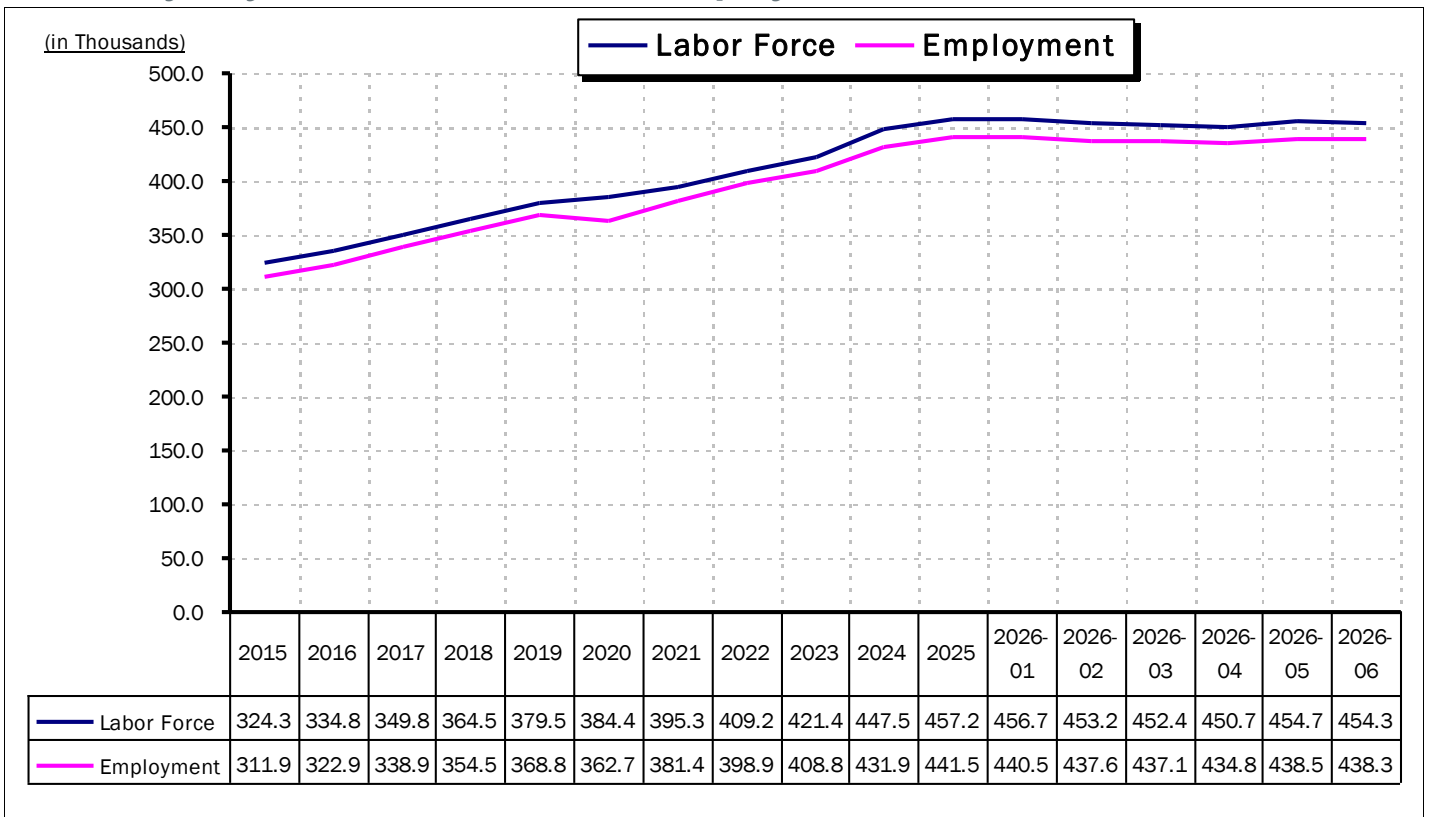

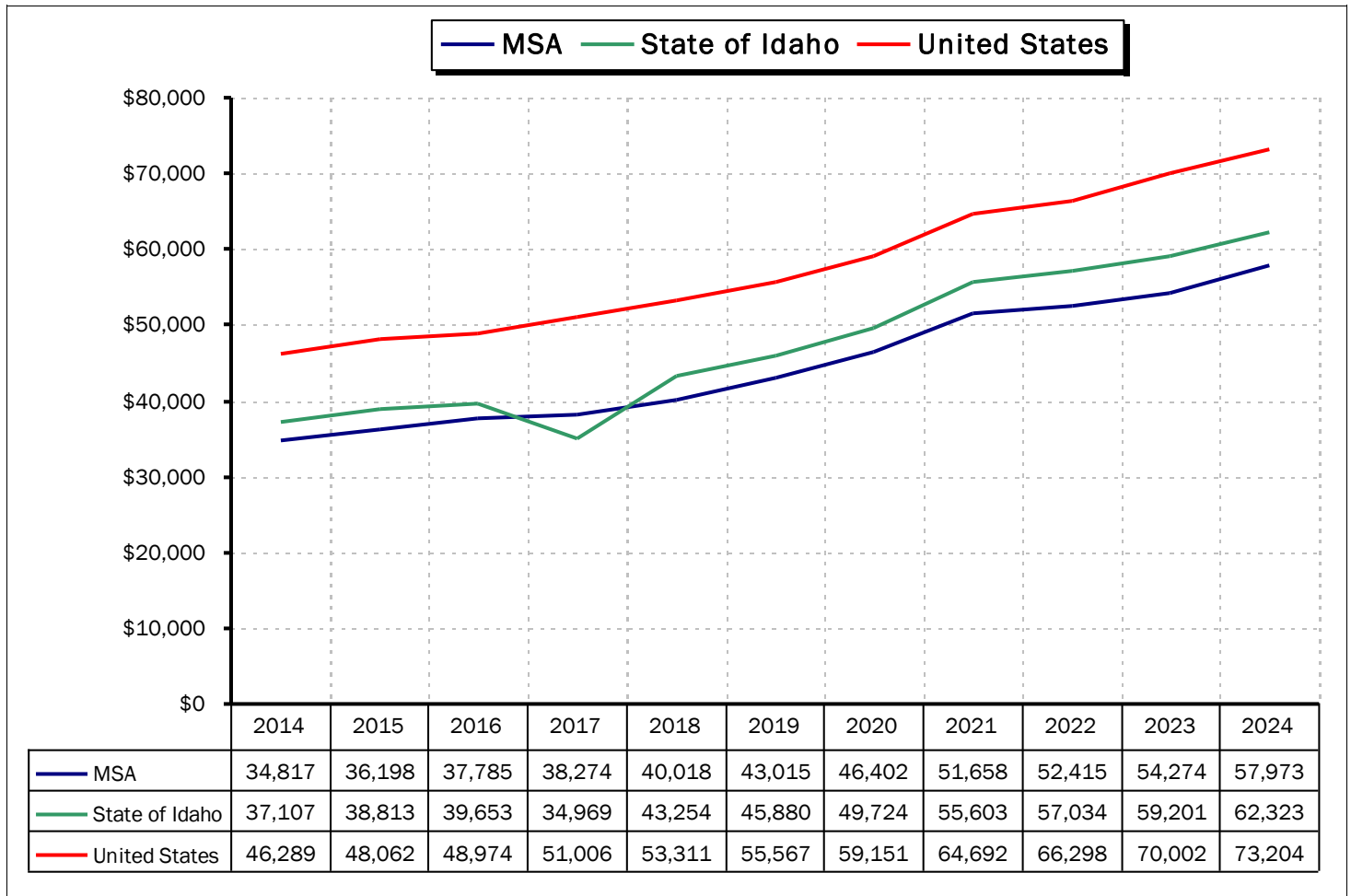

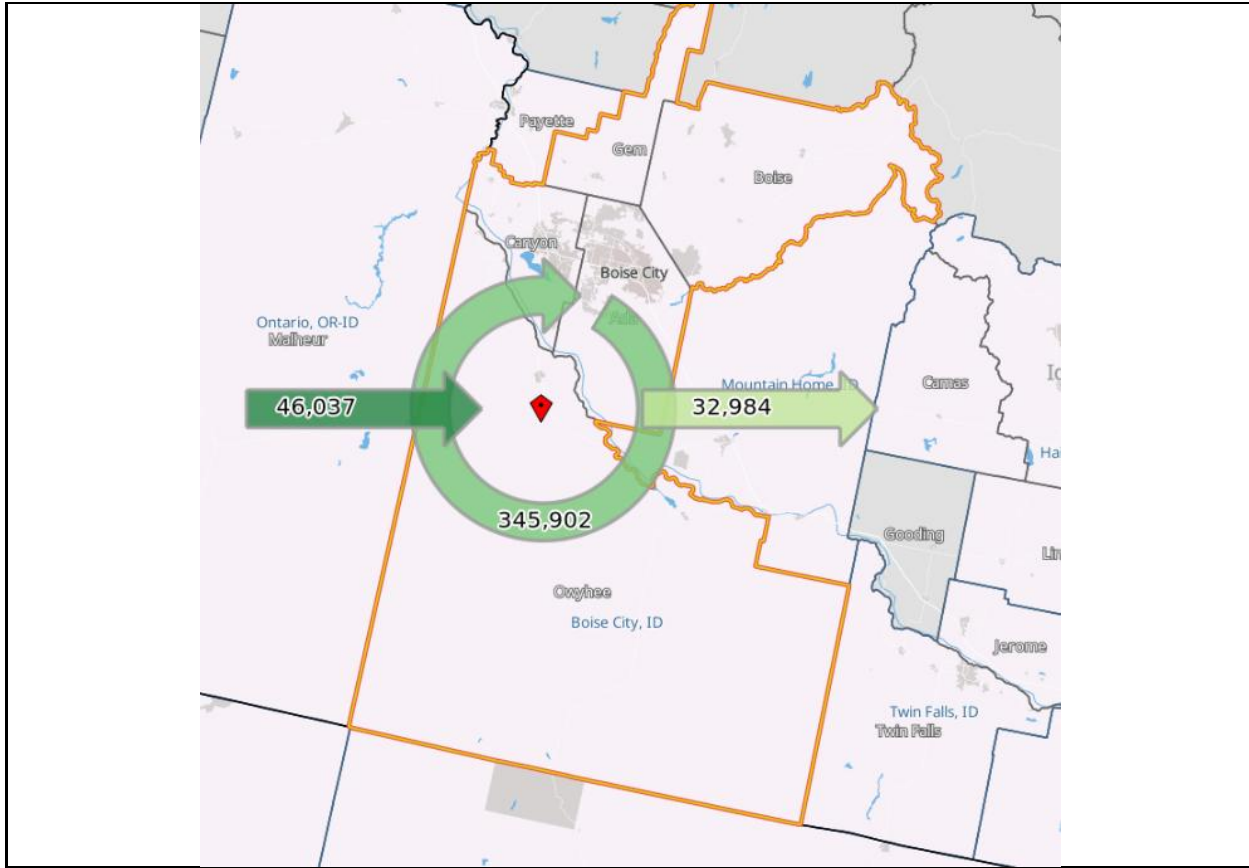
7. Per Capita Income, 2014 to 2024

It is estimated that 345,902 workers lived and worked in the Boise-Nampa MSA in 2023. Another 46,037 workers were employed in the Boise-Nampa MSA but lived outside, while 32,984 workers lived in the area but commuted outside for work.
