

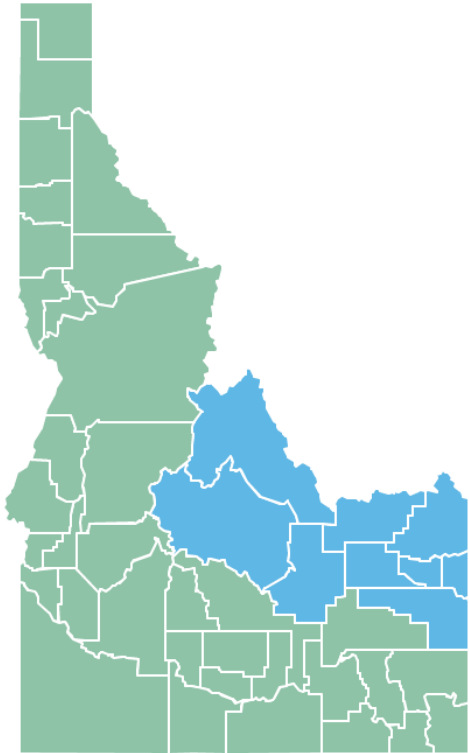

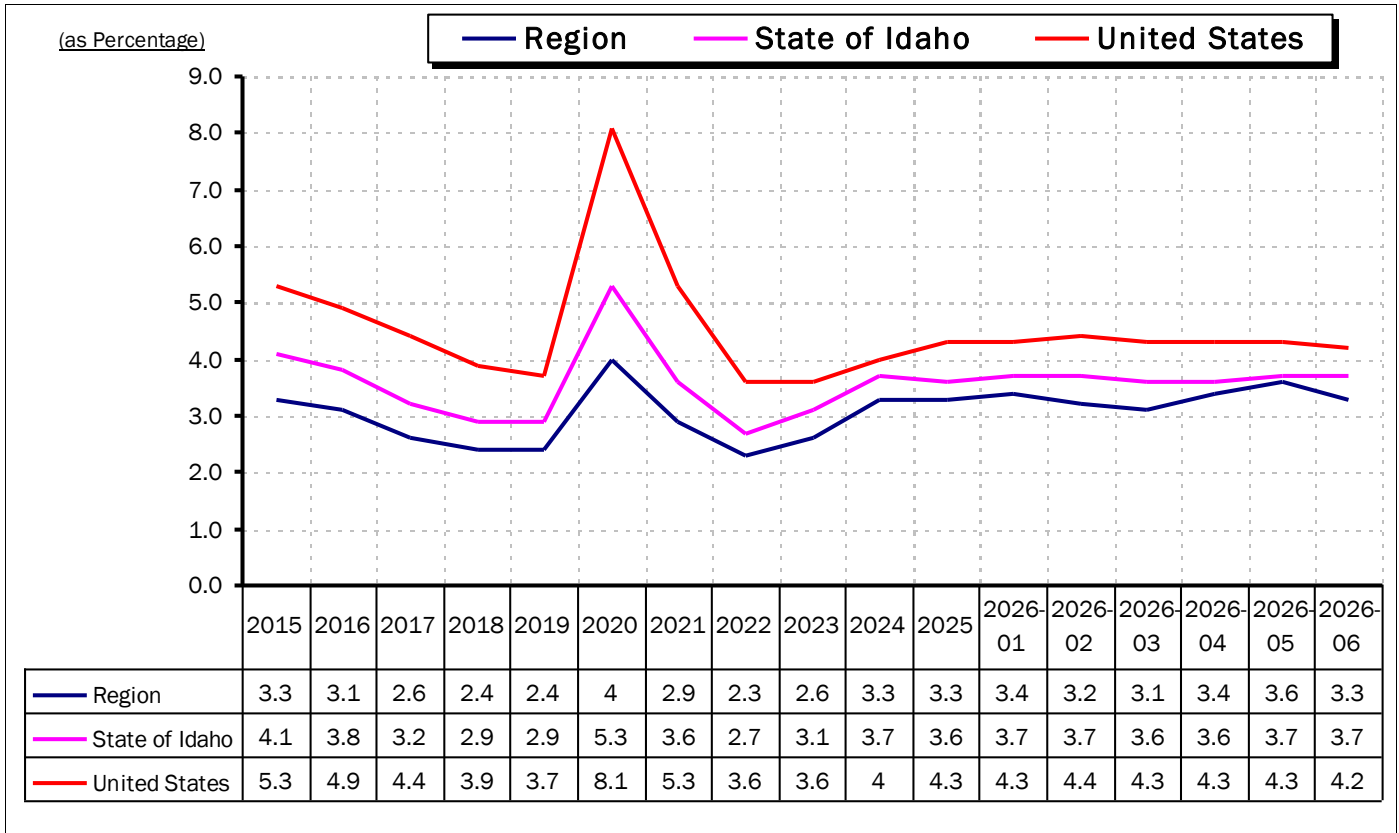

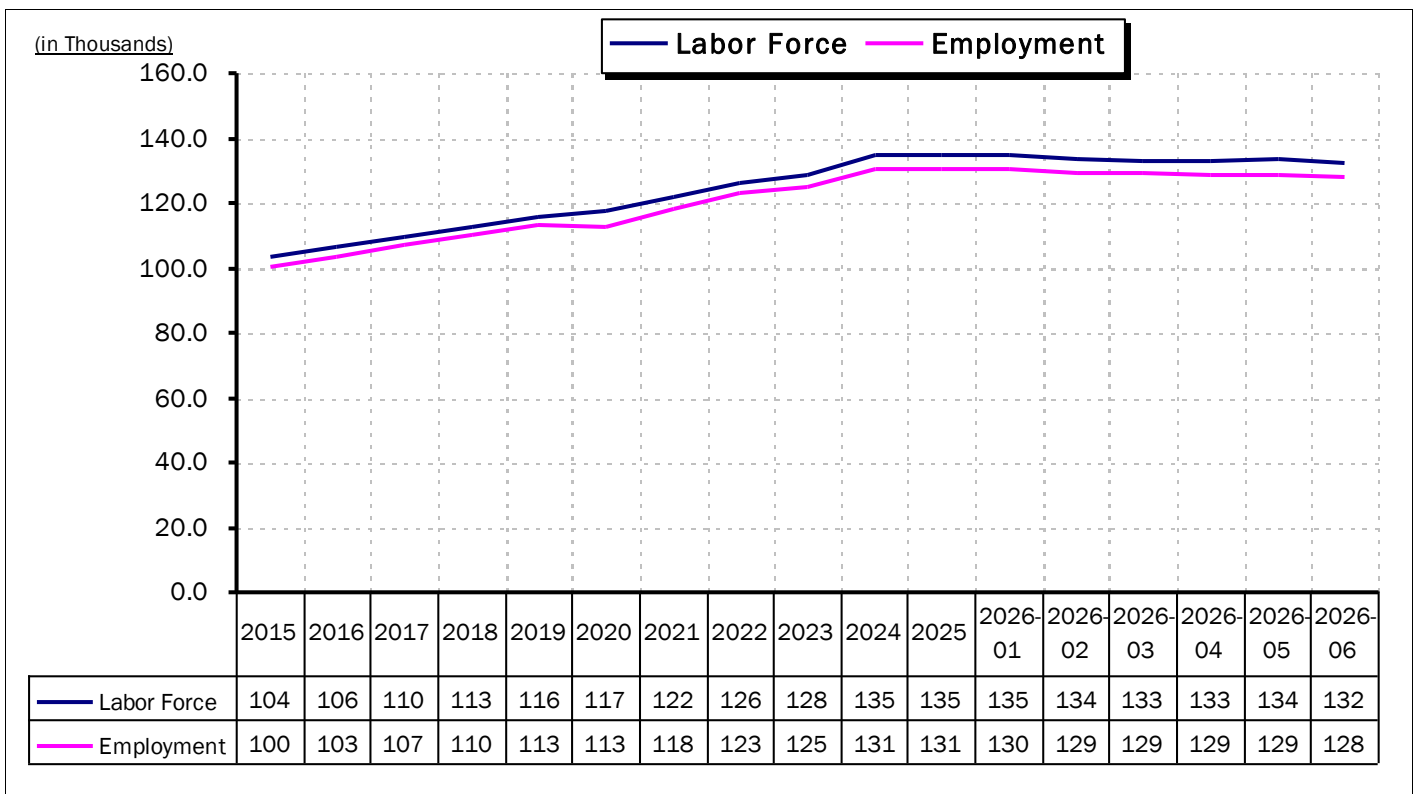

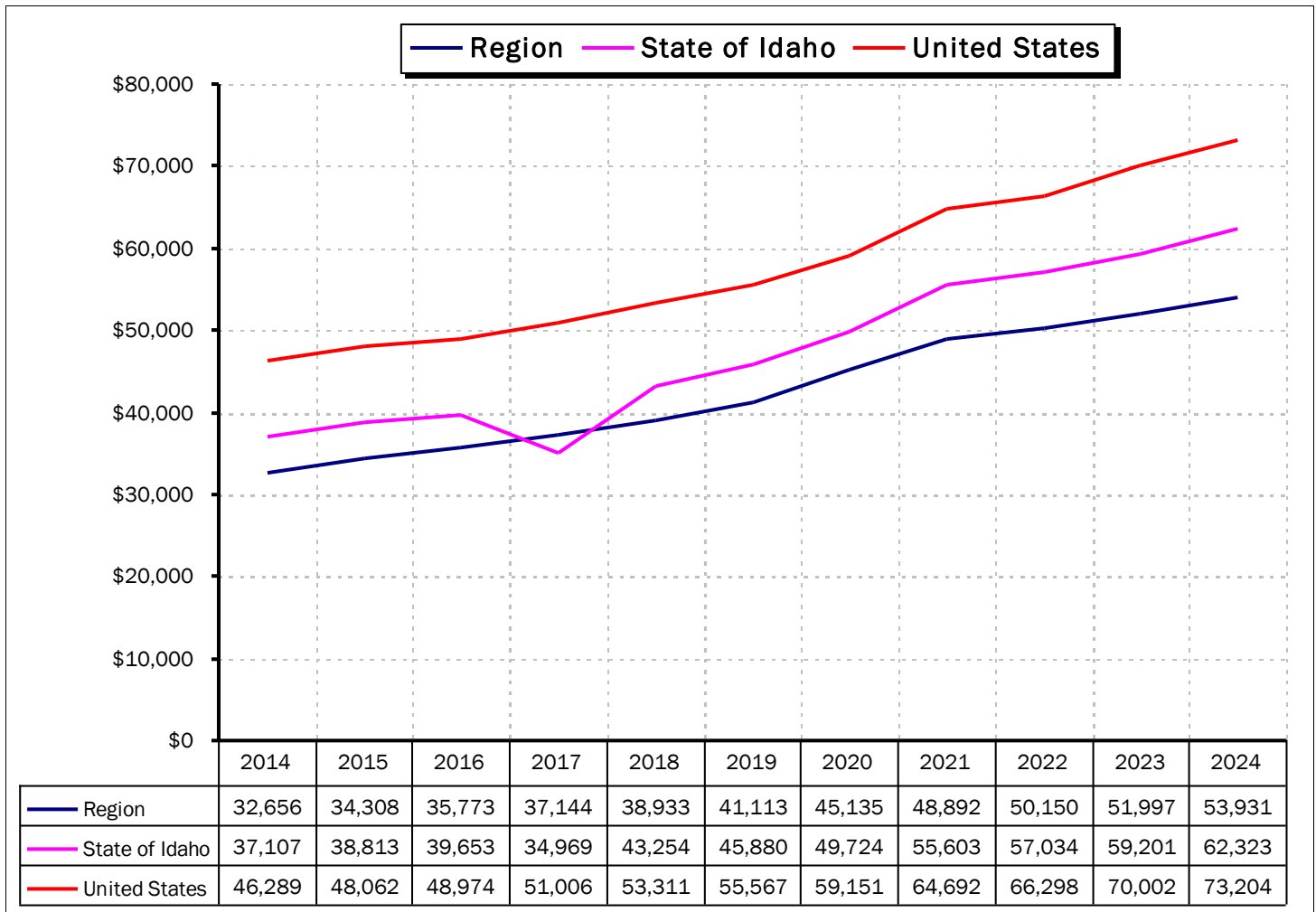

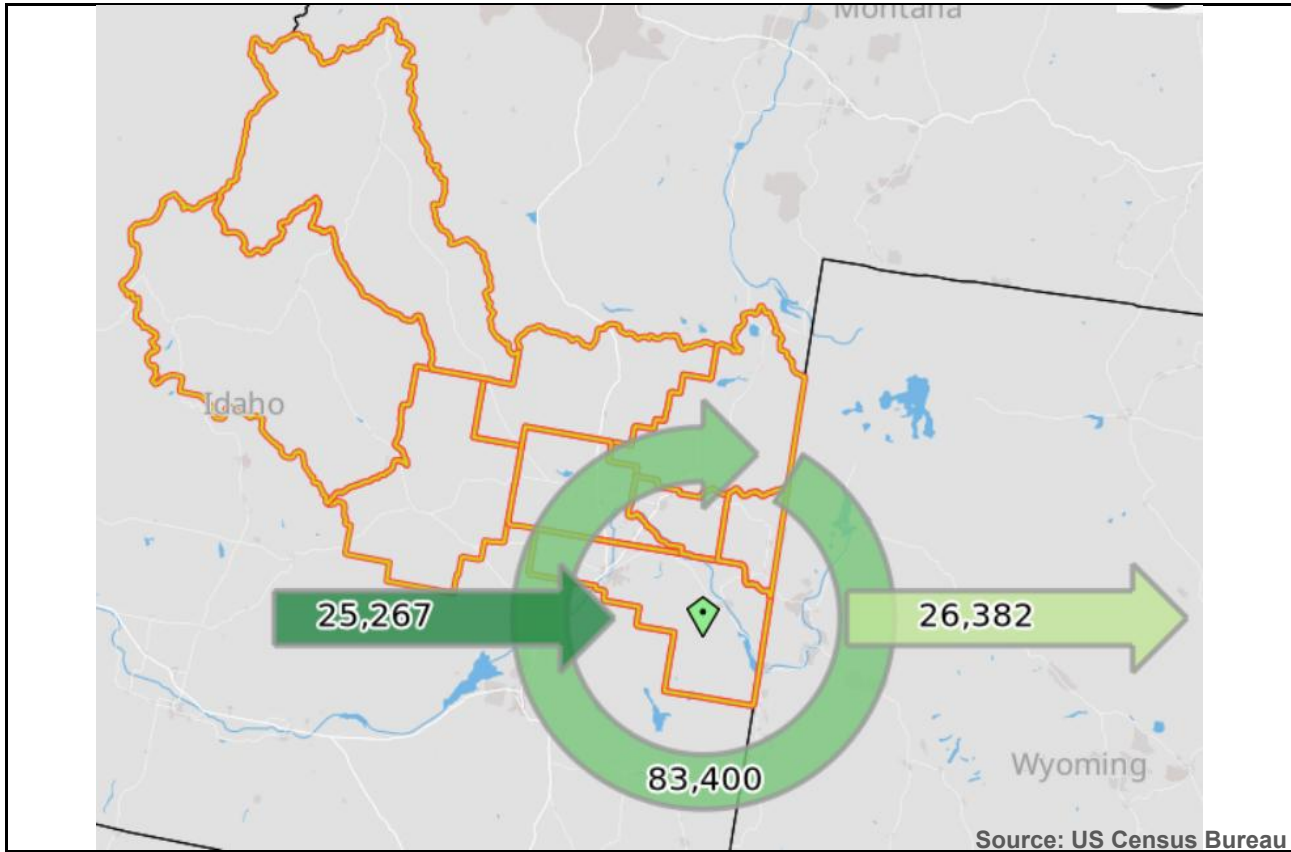

It is estimated that 83,400 workers lived and worked in Eastern Idaho in . Another 25,267 workers were employed in Eastern Idaho but lived outside, while 26,382 workers lived in the area but commuted outside for work.
