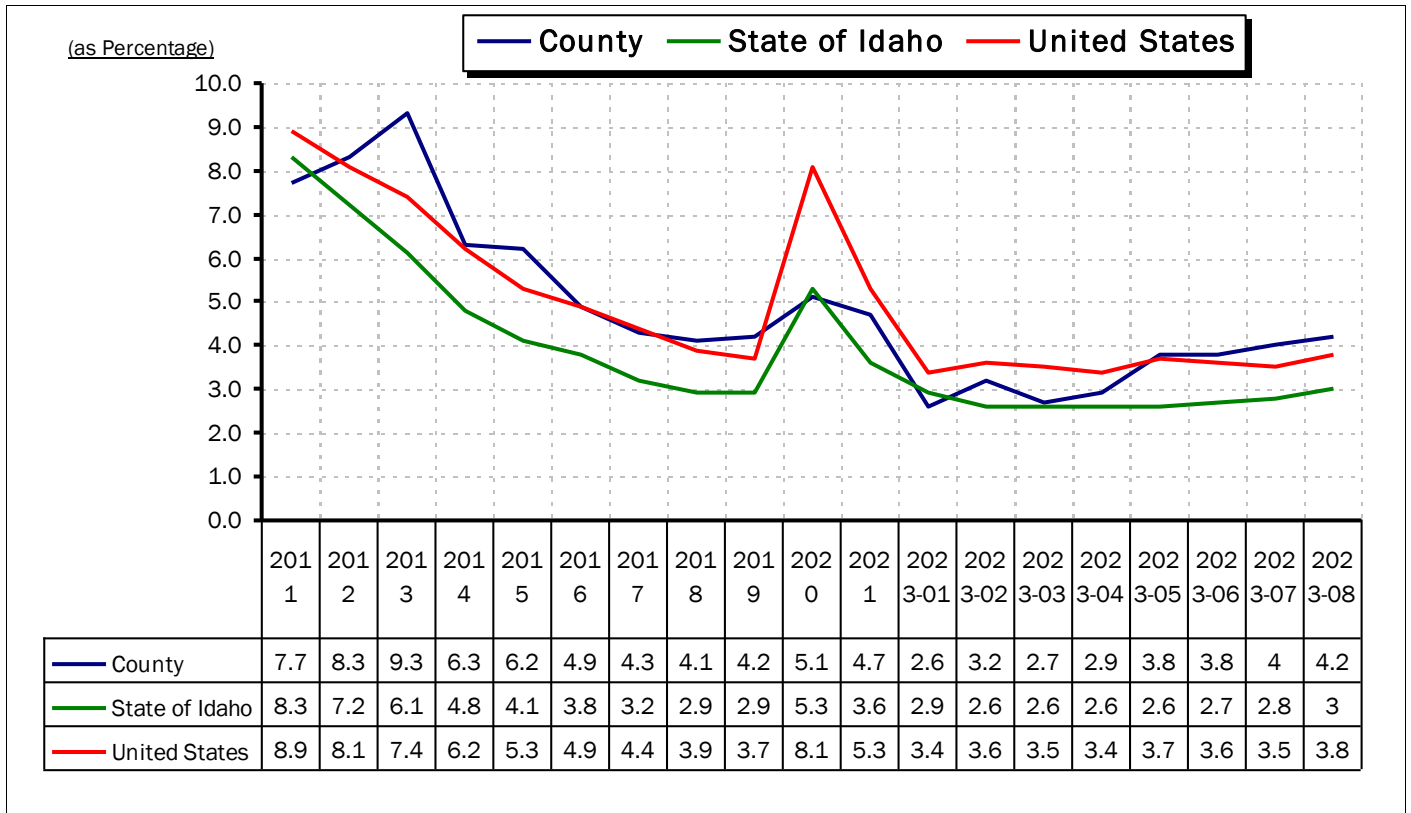

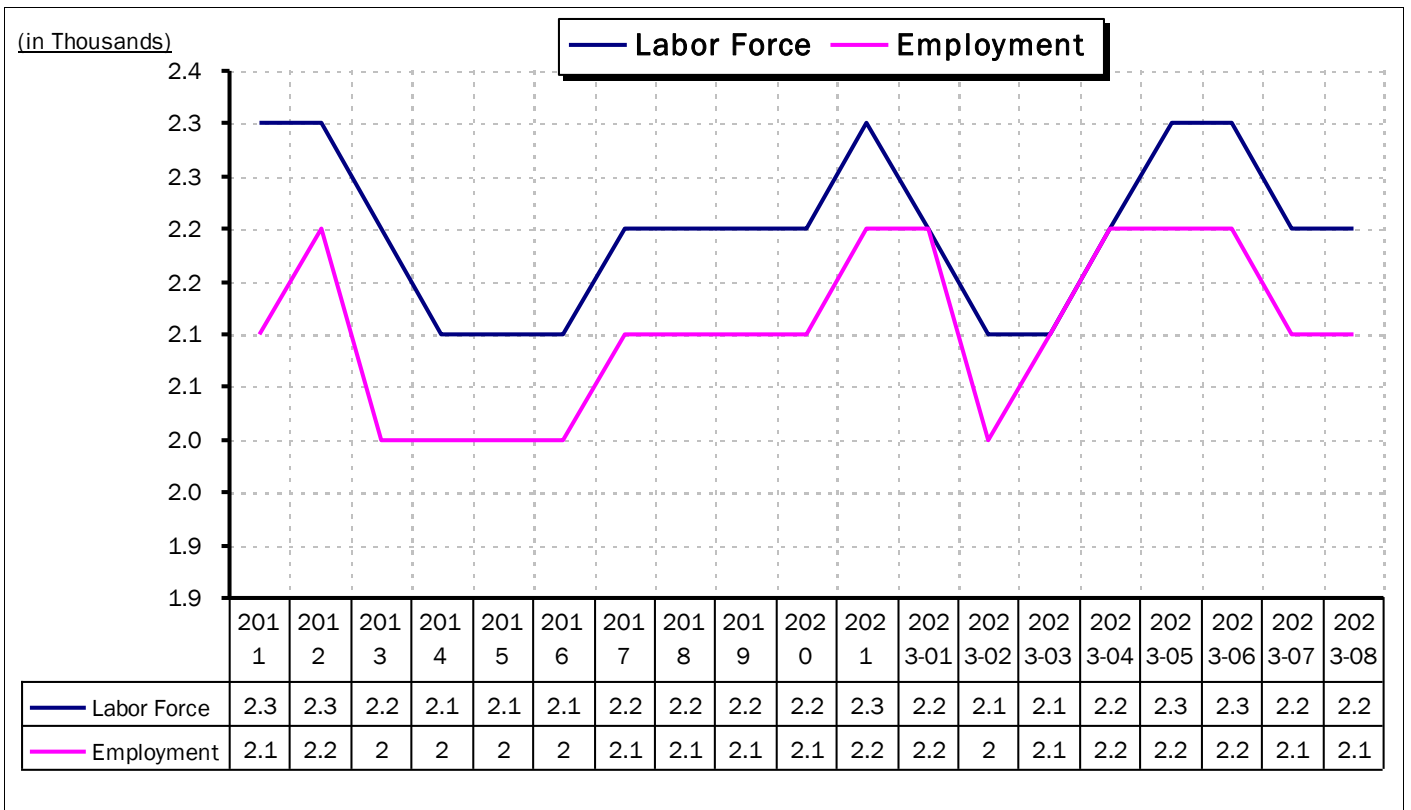

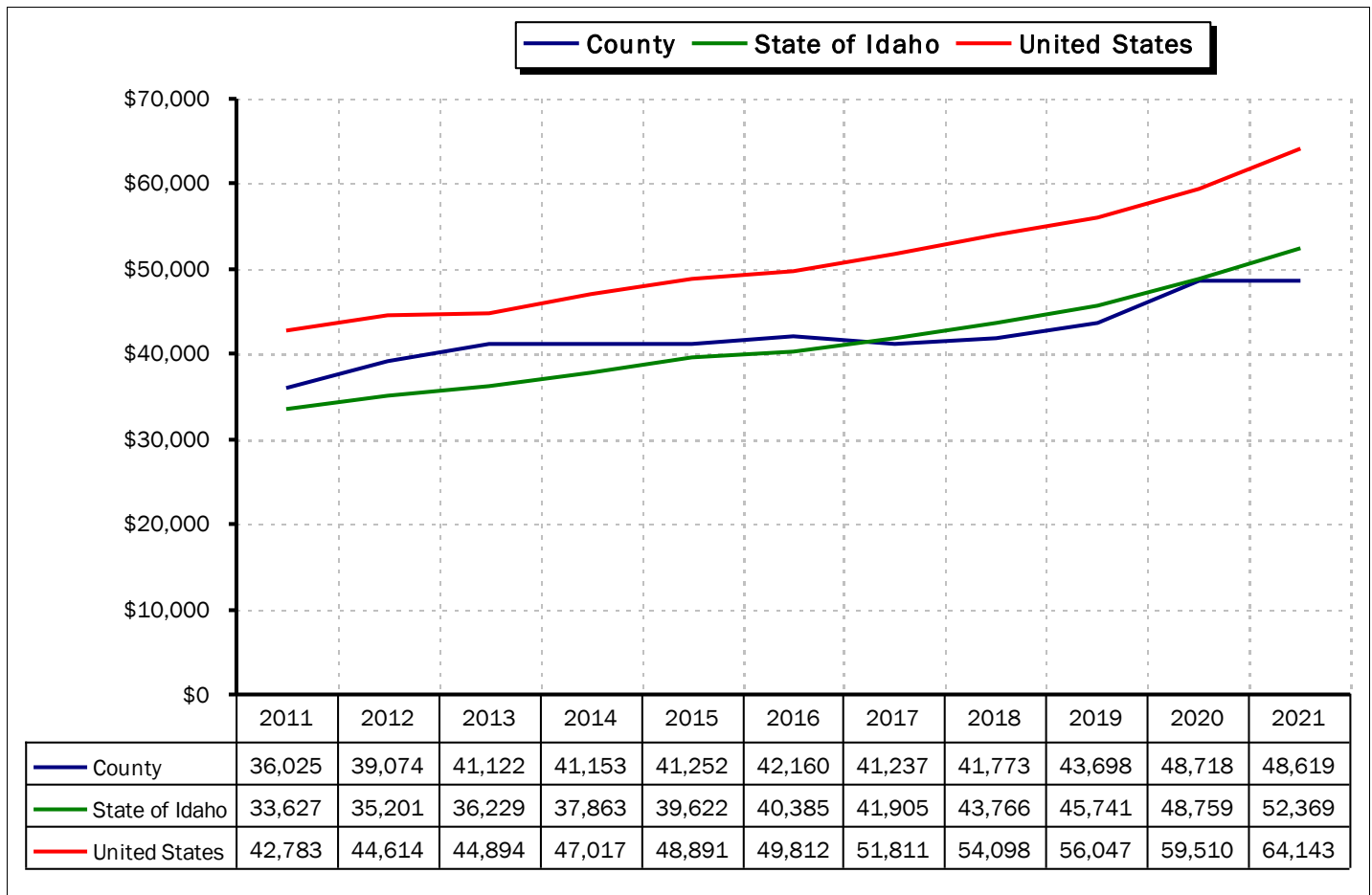

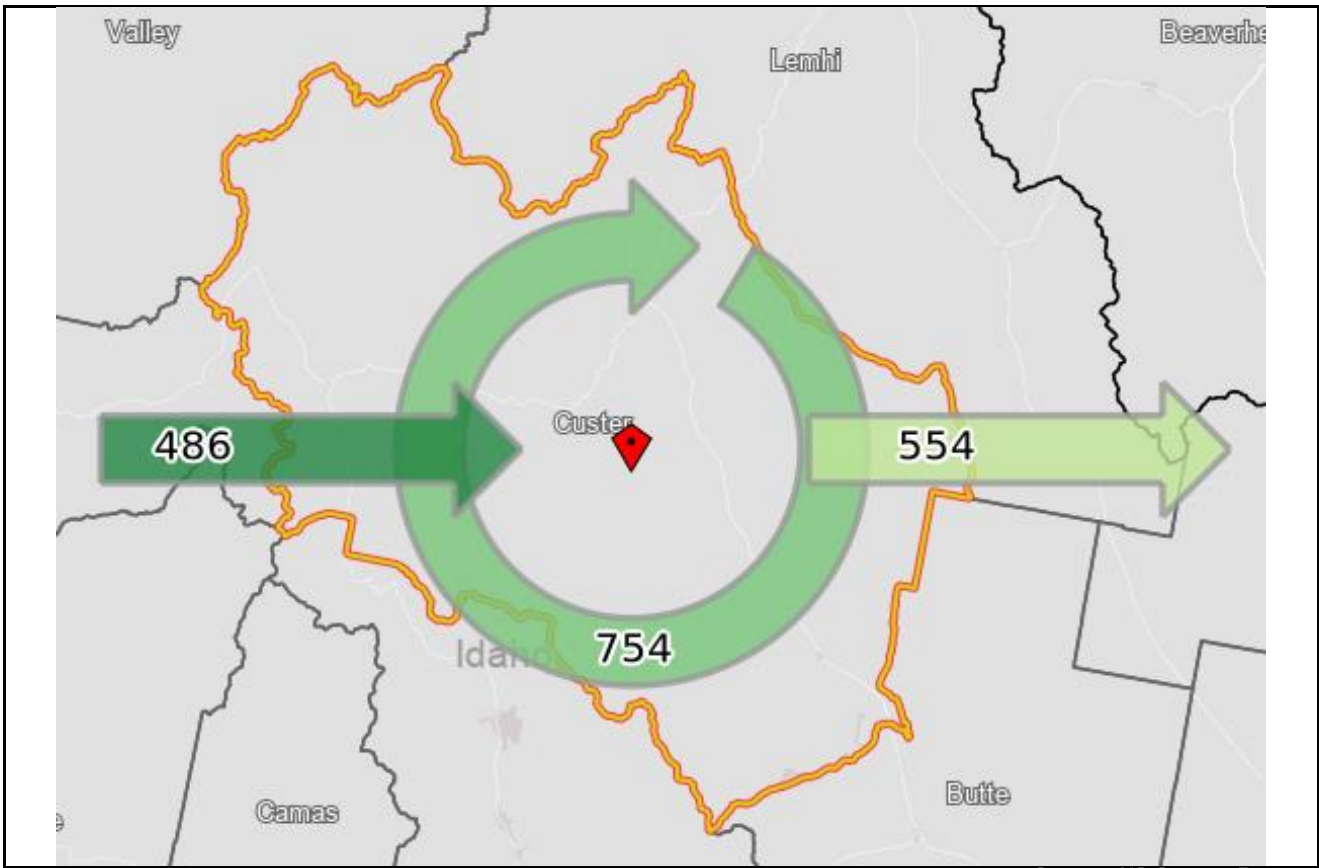
7. Real Per Capita Income, 2011 to 2021
